Dear Southeast Region Members,

In celebration of the beginning of summer, there were many SER of the WOCN® Society members who traveled to Canada to attend the WOCN® Society and CAET joint conference. It was wonderful to have 38 SER members attended our regional membership meeting. North Carolina had the largest representation at 16 members; Florida was a close second at 10 members.

While in Canada, Jennifer Anderson (President-Elect) and I attended the Regional & Affiliate (R&A) President's Meeting. The Society leadership discussed each R&A needs regarding assistance/guidance on conducting Regional annual educational conferences. Most of the R&A noted similar challenges with each handling the problems uniquely and individually with regards to coordinating and providing conferences. The Region had addressed these issues many years ago and has had a Management Firm for the past decade; and last year we hired an Event Planner to also assist each State with the coordination of our annual conferences' logistics. The Society is committed to devise a plan to provide support to the R&A in the future with conference planning.

During the Society membership meeting, it was announced the Society has 5040 members; 84% of our membership have wound certifications, 46% have ostomy certification and 12% continence certification. The Southeast Region membership has increased to over 730 members. We remain the largest Region within the Society.

Some hot topics discussed at the Society membership meeting included Bylaw Amendments updates, NPUAP updated terminology and Public Policy concerns. Kate Lawrence (Past President) and others are working continuously to keep members of Congress informed about WOC issues. If you haven't already registered for the 2016 SER of the WOCN[®] Society Conference, now is the time to do so. Karen Sanders, conference chair, and her North Carolina conference committees are planning a tremendous program. I have more exciting news for those of you seeking free online CEs for recertification. Dr. Gregory Schultz, Ph.D. has graciously granted permission for us to use his presentation, "Battling Biofilms", from the 2015 fall conference for our next eLearn opportunity. And, he did this at no charge to the region!

Dr. Schultz is a Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology and the Director of the Institute for Wound Research as the University of Florida. He has published over 320 scientific research papers, reviews and book chapters that have been cited over 7,000 times. He is past President of the Wound Healing Society (1999-2001) as well as the NPUAP Board of Directors. He has given over 150 lectures at national and international meetings on molecular regulation of wound healing and bacterial biofilms.

We are so appreciative to Dr. Schultz for sharing his work with us and providing those of you, who weren't able to attend the 2015 conference in Orlando, with the opportunity to still learn from it. Expect to see this presentation popping up on the website (www.serwocn.org) in the near future and earn your free CEs while you learn more about biofilms.

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
